A minimum of 15 credit hours in 300 or 400 level Accounting courses must be taken at WCU. A minimum of 30 credits in business courses must be taken at WCU. Business electives must be 300 level or above. ENG 368 may be treated as a Business Elective.

A minimum grade of C must attained in all MAJOR AREA courses undertaken and ECO 111, ECO 112, ACC 201, ACC 202, ECO 251, ECO 252, BLA 201, MGT 200, FIN 325, MKT 325, MGT 341, MGT 499, and MAT 105 or 107 or 110. Students must maintain a 2.5 overall GPA and pass an Excel proficiency exam to register for 300 or 400 level business courses and to graduate.

Any of the courses in which a grade of C is not earned must be repeated until a grade of C or better is earned. *Restricted elective – This elective may not be a business course OVER

GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM CHOICES

I. Distributive Requirements (21 semester hours)

A. Science (6 semester hours)

One course in computer science (either CSC 110, 115 or 141) is required in the business program. Select one additional course from the following areas: Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, or Physics

Recommended courses are:

Biology – BIO 100 or BIO 110	Physics – PHY 100, 105, 130, 140, 170 or 180
Earth Science – ESS 101 or 111	Chemistry – CHE 100, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106 or 107

B. Behavioral and Social Sciences (6 semester hours)

Both ECO 111 and ECO 112 are required in the business program; one of which will satisfy a social science requirement for non-economics majors.

Recommended courses are:

Anthropology – ANT 102 or 103 Sociology – SOC 200 or 240 Government – PSC 100, 101 or 213 Psychology – PSY 100 Geography – GEO 101 or 103

C. Humanities (6 semester hours)

One course in philosophy (ether PHI 101, 150 or 180) is required in the business program. *Taking PHI 101 or 150 will require an additional Diversity course* Select on additional course in literature or history.

Recommended courses are:

Literature – LIT 165, CLS 165, CLS 260 or CLS 261 History – HIS 101, 102, 150, 151, 152

D. The Arts (3 semester hours)

Select one art course from one of the following areas: art, cinematography, dance, music, photography, and theatre.

II. Academic Foundations (18 credits)

- A. English Composition (6 semester hours)
- **B.** Mathematics (3 semester hours)
- C. Communication (3 semester hours)
- D. Diversity Requirement (3 semester hours)

A diversity course (J) is required for all students regardless of credits transferred.

E. Interdisciplinary Requirements (3 semester hours)

An interdisciplinary course (I) is required for all students regardless of credits transferred.

III. Additional Baccalaureate Requirements

Writing Emphasis Courses (3-9 semester hours)

All students who take their entire general education program at WCU must complete three approved writing emphasis courses. All students who enter with fewer than 40 credits must take at least three approved writing emphasis courses at WCU. Transfer students who enter with 4-70 credits must take two writing emphasis courses. Students who transfer more than 70 credits must take one writing emphasis course.

Note: Dual degree candidates that meet the requirements for graduation meet the Writing Emphasis requirements.
