DIRECTIONS TO CONFERENCE

Conference Location:

West Chester University's Graduate Business Center is located at 1160 McDermott Drive, West Chester, PA, 19380. The Graduate Business Center is easily accessible from the Boot Road exit of Route 202.

From the Commodore Barry Bridge:

Coming from New Jersey across the Commodore Barry Bridge, follow signs for Route 322W. Follow Route 322W to Route 1. Turn left on Route 1. Turn right onto Route 202N. Exit Route 202 at Boot Road. Make a right at the traffic light at the end of the ramp. Make a right at the next traffic light at Greenhill Road.

**Take Greenhill Road for approximately .5 miles. Turn left onto McDermott Dr. The Graduate Business Center is the third building on the right.

From 95 North or South:

Take 95 North or South to Route 202 North (Concord Pike). Follow Route 202 North until the Boot Road exit. Make a right at the traffic light at the end of the ramp. Make a right at the next traffic light at Greenhill Road.

From Schuylkill Expressway:

Who Should Attend?

This program is appropriate for professional speechlanguage pathologists (SLPs) and for SLP students with an interest in interprofessional collaboration (IPC). The specific focus will be on IPC in settings where professionals in applied behavior analysis (ABA) share overlapping responsibilities with SLPs in the service of individuals with autism spectrum disorders (ASD).

Program Summary

Individuals with ASD present with a spectrum of challenges, and it takes a village of caring professionals to support their spectrum of needs. SLP and ABA professionals are important members of that village, and constructive IPC is crucial to quality service delivery. However, the data indicate that SLP-ABA collaboration is not always without challenges. Some challenges arise from insufficient information about the science of ABA and about the qualifications of ABA service providers. Others arise from a dearth of information about strategies for resolving differences in clinical approaches. The purpose of this presentation is to examine some of these challenges, to provide authentic information about ABA, and to consider strategies used by SLP and ABA professionals based on their experiences of successful IPC. Clinical examples will be provided throughout the presentation.

- Mareile Koenig, Ph.D., CCC-SLP, BCBA, is a Professor of Communication Sciences and Disorders at WCU, specializing in child language and autism.
- Corinne Murphy, PhD, CBA-D is Associate Professor and Chairperson of WCU's Department of Special Education. She also serves as Executive Director of SPARC.
