**PURPOSE OF COURSE:** To be taken when the student begins his/her report or thesis research. This course, along with the subsequent EXS 699, is the culminating experience in the program curriculum. It includes development of hypothesis and methods under the direction of a faculty advisor. If taken for thesis, this course should culminate in the acceptance of the thesis proposal by an appropriate committee of faculty. If taken either as a report or a thesis, the course results in the writing of the first three chapters (Introduction, Review of Literature, and Methods) according to the Graduate Studies *Masters Thesis Guidelines*, and IRB approval: http://www.wcupa.edu/\_admissions/sch\_dgr/documents/thesisguide.pdf.

# **GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

To develop a hypothesis or question to answer by collecting data and statistical analysis with your research advisor; if thesis option, form your committee as per Graduate Studies guidelines

To develop the methods for data collection and statistical analysis

To thoroughly review the literature

To complete and submit an IRB application for your research


