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#### • Updates:

- Reminded us that CoT does NOT set policy. CoT approves/disapproves policies set by administration.
- Mentioned and read a few passages from article\_Disfiguring of Higher Education in March 22, 2015 issue\_London Review of Books.\_Article about higher education in England; thought this was a mirror image of what is happening to higher education in US. - Tuition by Credit any changes will not take place before Fall 2016. Must ensure long term fiscal health of institution. Governor is proposing a restoration of funding WITHOUT tuition increases. WCU gets smallest percentage of any PASSHE school in the state
- Distant education people seem to want it. Somehow have to pay for it. Asked if there were any concerns.
- External Operations WCU is reaching out to others who cannot attend main campus. CoT is supportive; management is considering community college expansion. Trustees have not received any proposal to expand beyond.
- Relationship with PASSHE Eli has met a few times with the Chancellor. He really is starting to understand WCU's position. # pieces of legialation1. Not having to go through Building Services; 2. Intellectual property provision- Desire to become more research focused; 3. Definition of public funds for tuition BOG & legislators probably won't pass the third piece of legislation.

#### Questions for Eli Silberman

- Bessie L. asked about extra fee beyond 12 credits; Heather S. suggested that workload has increased due to teaching online. David B. mentioned that he prefers face to face teaching; added individual conferences. Numbers range from 22 – 150 students/course.
- Eli D. brought up branch campus Philadelphia. What would be needed to be successful from the start? Different types of students pose different challenges; research is tougher; security; tutoring; career development, etc. Strategic plan would be helpful. Eli mentioned funding as important and asked if there was a place to raise these concerns. What would programs/departments need to be successful?
- Ellie B. asked about budget being a real challenge with increasing student enrollment. What is long-term plan for high quality, reasonably priced tuition? Dealing with challenges as they arise. A vision about where WCU will be going in the future? Realistically look at funding sources. Eli S. believes the future is optimistic, and taxes will have to go up

#### • Presentation of General Education Reform (see PowerPoint)

- Proposal has already been released. In lieu of a presentation, Rodney went straight to answering questions.

- David B. asked about how the model was developed/chosen. Transformative, dynamic (Model C) has all elements that committee. Meetings were held and revisions were made without being predetermined.
- Eli asked about accredited programs/regimented? Rodney met with a number of departments with tightly scripted programs. Sophomore Pathways & Themed Pathways may need to be taken earlier. Rodney believes we can 'do no harm', but it will require work; being accepting of change. Rodney believes the Provost and administration are supportive of any revision of the Gen Ed program.
- Eli asked about transfer students? Rodney believes we can work with this and have to figure out a way to slot them in. Associate degree students (by law) must be given credit for the ir academic work.
- Heather S. asked about advising. Does anything change? Rodney believes that advising will be easier and more transformative in improving how faculty talk about what the courses are doing for the students' knowledge, career, etc. Electronic Portfolio may assist advising too.
- -Bessie asked about Communication Studies being burdened by limited course enrollment.

Action: Senators are encouraged to continue to bring issues to the CoT.
