Gilboy): announcement approved and posted; application closure date is 9/27/13; over 70 applicants; initial review of applicants almost complete; secondary review of applicants to be completed week of 9/30/13 - College of Business & Public Affairs Dean (J. Brenner): announcement will be posted in next week; selecting candidates for airport interviews by mid-December; airport interviews late January; candidates come to campus early March 2014 • Sexual Misconduct Policy: - Broader issue: in need of different procedures to handle sexual misconduct on campus -Many offices/committees across campus (i.e., Social Equity, Women's Center, President's Commission on Status of Women) are committed to reviewing and amending procedures - WCU Sexual Harassment Policy Language Revision as of July 2013: "University employees are required to provide the name of the victim of any sexually harassing behavior to the Director of Social Equity" with 24 hours of obtaining this information.

- o Revised policy language now prohibits anonymous reporting; scientific evidence illustrating underreporting when non-anonymous reporting policies in effect
- o Possible rationale of revision: to be in compliance with Title IX in 1998 Clery Act

- Responses:

- Subcommittee on Sexual Assault/Sexual Harassment of WCU's Women's and Gender Studies Program Response: issued letter outlining evidence for anonymous reporting (also sent to via email to Senators
- o ASPCUF Response: puts undue burden on untenured faculty for fear of losing job
- Faculty Senate Response: Exec have discussed the issue; opened to Senate for discussion
 - Comments from Senators: Social justice/diversity issue; CCIT is monitoring this issue Strategic plan missing coordination across groups; Barb Schneller provided training in dept (What is sexual harassment? What is reportable?); Where did this policy change come from? Is legal liability driving the concern?); Fear it will undermine student reporting to faculty
 - Proposed Choices on how Faculty Senate should respond: (1) no response, (2) brief resolution, or (3) letter in response (E. Brown distributed draft response letter to Senators for their review)
 - + Questions posed: What are the consequences for failing to comply with mandatory reporting victim names? Clarification of mandatory reporting of victim names.
 - + G. Martin motioned, B. Olesen seconded, all Senators approved letter to be publicly distributed to all faculty
 - + Resolution: Consult other groups involved (APSCUF and Women's and Gender Studies Program Sexual Assault/Sexual Harassment Subcommittee [their letter was already sent to President, Provost and PASSHE Counsel]) to ensure sending to all faculty distribution list is acceptable/appropriate; ask what is happening PASSHE system wide
 - + Following consultation with APSCUF and the Women's and Gender Studies Program subcommittee, the senate will assess appropriateness of extended dissemination beyond just faculty

• Weapons Policy (E. DeHope):

- No weapons are currently permitted on campus; however, the mid-October 2013 Board
 of Governors Meeting will be discussing possible policy change where weapons would
 need to be registered with campus public safety and a registered owner could carry
 weapons on campus in common areas but could not carry weapons in academic
 buildings
- No clear rationale why weapons policy change is being proposed except for 2nd
 Amendment and Kutztown University's recent weapons policy change
- Responses:
 - o Commission of Presidents of the PASSHE (May 22, 2013) resolution
 - Faculty Senate Response: DeHope drafted brief resolution to retain current policy where weapons are not permitted on campus (to be sent to BOG) (J. Onderdonk motioned, Brad seconded, all Senators approved)
- Retrenchment (E. Brown):
 - Retrenchment at three universities: Clarion (14 faculty members), Edinoborough, Mansfield (29 faculty members)
 - APSCUF petition and information about retrenchment (email from APSCUF)
 - Implications for WCU faculty searches contact HR for more specific info if conducting a faculty search
 - How can we help? Lisa Millhous suggested Visiting Scholar Program for faculty who have been retrenched from other PASSHE schools
 - Faculty Welfare Committee may wish to follow up on this issue
