- submit a completed application by September 14, 2017. Your application must be received not later than 5:00pm of this date.

The FDI Book Award will be presented at a ceremony in May 16th 2018. Award Recipients must attend the dinner to receive their award. Book Award recipients are expected to participate in FDI activities and serve as FDI ambassadors during the 2017-2018 academic year.

Application for Frederick Douglass Institute Book Award

Biographical Essay (150-word essay): A biographical essay should be about yourself and can reflect a number of topics relating to your academic career, future goals, your relationship to Frederick Douglass, why you deserve this award, etc. Feel free, if applicable, to include information regarding your scholarship and honors and community service.

Essay Topic: A 300-word essay on "Human Rights at Home and Abroad."

Your essay can focus on a number themes relating to human rights. Potential essays may include but are not limited to the following:

- How recent events in Syria, Korea, Iran, China, the EU, Russia, the United States, and other countries have tackled issues related to human rights.
- How social networks such as Facebook and Twitter, Instagram, the internet, and cell phones have become resourceful tools for documenting struggles for human rights.
- How threats against human rights affect international relations and efforts for peace and communication.
- Charter Schools vs. Public Schools and the concern over segregated education
- Dream Act and Citizenship
- Building a border "Wall"
- Transgender public access to restrooms.
- ACA Affordable Care Act
- Employment Discrimination
- EPA and environmental concerns (Flint Michigan, PA School water)
- Age, race, gender, religious, physical handicap discrimination
- Diversity in the classroom and the dorm room
- Gun violence
- Opioid Endemic and Stigmatization
- Black Lives Matter movement
- Mass incarceration, police brutality and injustices against monitories in the United States

Your essay can also focus on a quotation from Frederick Douglass:

- "No man can put a chain about the ankle of his fellow man without at last finding the other end fastened about his own neck."
- "To suppress free speech is a double wrong. It violates the rights of the hearer as well as those of the speaker."
- "Knowledge make a man unfit to be a slave."
- "Once you learn to be read, you will be forever free."
- "It is easier to build strong children than to repair broken men."
- "If there is no struggle, there is no progress. Those who profess to favor freedom, and yet depreciate agitation, are men who want crops without plowing up the ground."

General Instructions for Writing Essay:

- Each page should include your name.
- The first page should be the autobiographical essay.
- The second page should be your Human Rights Essay or a quote from Frederick Douglass essay.
- Font is 12pt, Times New Roman
