Eligibility Requirements: Courses are open to juniors and seniors with a cumulative GPA of 2.8. Note that MAT 131: Precalculus has a prerequisite as noted below.

### **MAT 131. Section 02. Precalculus. 3 credits.**

**Schedule:** MWF 10:00-12:30

**Format:** In Person

Topics include polynomial, rational, exponential, logarithmic, and trigonometric functions. An emphasis is placed on understanding function properties and graphs without the use of technology. Successful completion of this course prepares students for MAT 161: Calculus I. Prerequisite: MAT 131 requires a prerequisite of a "B" or better in high school Algebra I and Algebra II and a recommendation form signed by the student's high school math teacher. If the student is currently taking Algebra II, a "B" or better on the latest progress report is acceptable.

### **LIT 165. Section 299. Topics in Literature. 3 credits.**

**Schedule:** MWF 10:00-12:30

**Format:** In Person

A course designed to develop awareness of literature as being central to all the arts, to increase levels of literacy and critical faculties, and to broaden understanding of the human condition. Prerequisites: None.

Location: Both courses are offered in-person at [WCU's Philadelphia Center](#), located at 701 Market Street in the lower level of the Lits Building between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> streets in Center City.
