- OUTREACH out to immigrant communities, educators, policy makers, and our society






FILMWAKING AS WULTIMODAL RESEARCH



- CREATIIVE. Produce knowledge through creative modes (visual, audio, video, performative) that challenge traditional forms of knowledge production in academia.
- INTERDISCIPLINARY. Draw from interdisciplinary theories of cognitive justice, language acquisition, and migration studies.
- **ACTIVE.** Filmmaking as activism in the struggles for linguistic justice.
- ACCESS. Make research equitable and accessible.
- **EMOTIVE CAPACITY.** Capture affective dimension of my research.


