

- 1) We offer tutoring for most 100 and 200 level general education courses.
- 2) The academic success topics that we can help students with include time management, test preparation, note taking, essay writing, and more.
- 3) We host Academic Success Workshops (ASW's), which are one-hour interactive sessions that demonstrate the application of learning strategies.

Key Takeaways

New students struggling with academic success can visit the LARC for help with a number of things. If students find themselves struggling with a specific general education class or subject they should register for tutoring as early as possible and not wait until the very last moment before an exam.

- How do students sign up for tutoring?
 - Students must register for tutoring in person by visiting the LARC in the Lawrence center and bringing their course schedule. They can register for tutoring up until the 12th week of the semester.
- What does tutoring at the LARC entail?
 - Tutoring sessions are 50 minutes long and are held on a weekly basis. Sessions may include between three and five students. Once a student registers for a tutoring session, they must uphold the attendance policy.
