Please join us for the 33rd annual conference of the PASSHE Interdisciplinary Association of Philosophy and Religious Studies to be held Saturday, March 28th at Cheyney University in Cheyney, PA. We invite submissions in all areas of philosophy and religious studies. Undergraduate students, graduate students and faculty members (current and emeritus) are eligible to submit papers.

Keynote Address: Molefi Kete Asante (Temple University, Africology and African American Studies)

Undergraduate and Graduate Student Submissions: Papers should be 8-10 typed, double-spaced, numbered pages, 2000-3000 words (not counting notes) for a presentation time of 15-20 minutes. Your submission should include two separate files (prepared for “blind review” as described below):

1. The first file should include your paper, without the author’s name or university or any references to the PASSHE faculty who have offered feedback on it.
2. The second file should include an abstract of 150-250 words and the paper’s title, without the author’s name or university.
3. The body of your submission email should include: your name, status (undergraduate or graduate student), email address and word count for the paper.

Undergraduate submissions from students enrolled in PASSHE institutions are eligible for prizes of \$175.00, \$125.00 and \$100.00.

Janua Sophia, the undergraduate journal published by the department of English and Philosophy at Edinboro University of PA is accepting submissions and will give high consideration to those winning IAPRS awards.

Faculty Submissions: Abstracts of 150-250 words, with the author’s name, paper title, institutional affiliation, address, phone number and email address.

Deadline for submissions: Friday February 21, 2020
