Sample Syllabus for Integrative Health FYE

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Learning Objectives:

- 1. Students will be able to identify and implement strategies related to self-care to promote health and wellness.
- 2. Students will be able to recognize and employ effective communication strategies as part of integrated collaborative or interprofessional health care team.
- 3. Students will be able to describe and discuss ethical issues facing healthcare in the U.S.
- 4. Students will be able to differentiate between the various concepts of malpractice, error, and harms.
- 5. Students will be able to perform basic vital sign skills, safety precautions, and healthcare technologies in clinical setting.
