Applying for your social work license in **Delaware**

Delaware issues licenses for clinical social workers only.



Applying to take the clinical (LCSW) licensing exam

- You are eligible for a clinical license in Delaware after you have two years of clinical social work experience. You must have at least 3,200 clinical hours.
 - At least half of these hours need to have been directly supervised by a social worker with an LCSW. The rest do not need to have been under direct supervision.
 - If you can't find a clinical-level social worker to serve as your supervisor, you may receive supervision from a social worker with an MSW, a licensed psychologist, or a licensed psychiatrist. In this case you must also fill out the <u>Documentation of Attempts</u> to <u>Secure LCSW Supervision</u> form.
- You may take the ASWB Clinical Exam either before or after mailing your application for clinical licensure. See the <u>Association of Social Work Boards website</u> for locations.
- There are study guides and prep courses for the clinical examination available through <u>ASWB</u>.
 The <u>NASW-Delaware chapter</u> also holds prep courses.
- Other companies offer in-person and online exam preparation courses. The MSW Program at WCU does not vouch for the quality of these programs.
- After you pass the exam, submit the <u>Official Score Transfer Request Form</u> to have your score sent to the Board of Clinical Social Work Examiners.
- The board will issue your Delaware LCSW license once it receives your passing score from the ASWB Clinical Exam.

Receiving a license to practice at the clinical (LCSW) level

- Go to the website for the Board of Clinical Social Work Examiners and download the <u>Application for Licensure as a Clinical Social Worker</u>.
- Fill out the application and have it notarized. The application includes instructions for having your fingerprints processed.
- Order an official copy of your WCU transcript and have it sent to the board. You can <u>order your</u> <u>official transcript</u> from the WCU Registrar.
- If you haven't taken the ASWB Clinical Exam, the board will notify you when you are approved to take it.
- There are study guides and prep courses for the clinical examination available through <u>ASWB</u>. The <u>NASW-Delaware chapter</u> also holds prep courses.
- Take the exam. See the <u>ASWB website</u> for locations.
- After you pass the exam, have your score sent to the Board of Clinical Social Work Examiners.
- The Board of Clinical Social Work Examiners will issue your Delaware LCSW license once it receives your passing score from the ASWB Clinical Exam.
