*CONVERSATIONS ABOUT INTIMACY AND SEXUALITY*

#### *VALIDATION AND ACCEPTABILITY OF AN OBJECTIVE STRUCTURED CLINICAL EXAMINATION (OSCE)*

- Co-Principal Investigator with Dr. Amber Holbrook and Dr. Wan-Yi Chen
- Utilizing the OSCE, widely utilized as an assessment method in health professions, more recently adapted for use in social work (Bogo, Rawlings, Katz & Logie, 2014) this research employs "standardized patients" to enact predetermined scenarios designed to prompt demonstration of selected student competencies in Foundation Practice students during a recorded interaction
- This research is in a pilot phase and is a simultaneous collaboration between the Theatre Department at West Chester University and the Graduate Department of Social Work
- The video recorded interaction and structured reflection may be a superior method to assess and evaluate student demonstration of practice knowledge, skills, and values and the pilot study seeks to: 1) establish the validity and reliability of the objective structured clinical examination (OSCE) to be utilized in Graduate Social Work foundation practice courses; and 2) evaluate its acceptability to students of these courses
- A secondary analysis of de-identified student scores on the OSCE will be conducted to assess the internal consistency of the assessment rubric, and inter-rater reliability will be evaluated utilizing an additional faculty to score against the course instructor for each student video interaction and reflection. These data will be used to assess the validity and reliability of the OSCE as a measurement tool of student competencies
