Learn about Leah's integrated care team during her complicated journey at the hospital, traveling to and from home to the United States. This presentation dives into the research behind integrated care and how much it impacts quality patient care in the healthcare setting.



Bent Not Broken: Perseverance, Resilience, and Collaboration Presented by Christen Bradbury and Dr. Charelle Lockhart

In this presentation, we will take you through first-hand experiences of disaster relief responders for Hurricane Dorian from preparation through the storm, and the aftermath to the current state of affairs. Our stories will reflect on collaborative clinical efforts, both medical and psychosocial, aimed at supporting the complex needs of children and families. We will include statistics from Hurricane Dorian; best practices for trauma informed care in children; the development and evolution of relief efforts (by both locals and international organizations); cultural considerations; objectives of services and supports provided: self-care: and the remaining challenges affecting communities in the Bahamas.
