APPOINTMENTS AND FEES

The Clinic offers low-cost services for therapy and evaluation. A sliding scale and fee waivers are available and are based on income and extenuating circumstances. Fees for speechlanguage and hearing evaluations and intervention services are waived for students at Cheyney University, students at West Chester University, active and retired faculty and staff members, and Pennsylvania residents who are 70 years old or older. Fees are reduced by fifty percent for immediate family members of active and retired faculty and staff members at West Chester University. Appointments may be made by calling 610-436-3402.
