

West Chester University of Pennsylvania Certificate in Global Health Advising Sheet

Globalization has made it necessary for society to think about health from a global perspective, considering social, economic, and political impact. The Certificate in Global Health prepares students with the knowledge and skills necessary to apply a global lens to domestic work and/or conduct international work, by focusing on topics such as population distribution of health conditions; environmental and social determinants of health; health disparities, comparative health systems and policies; maternal, child, and adolescent health; development and implementation of global health programs, and global health partnerships.

Requirements: A total of 12 credit hours (four 3-credit hour courses) is required for the certificate program: Three credit hours in a required core and nine credit hours as electives from a list of approved courses. Students must earn a minimum grade of C in each certificate course and a minimum certificate completion GPA of 2.5 for the 4 certificate courses.

Modality: 100% Online, Hybrid, or Face-to-Face

Timeline: 1-2 years

Eligibility:

- ♦ Current WCU undergraduate student (any major) with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above or
- ◆ Non-degree seeking student who meets the minimum <u>university admission requirements</u> and must follow <u>university terms and conditions for non-degree students</u>.

CERTIFICATE IN GLOBAL HEALTH CORE COURSE + MAJOR REQUIRED ELECTIVES = 12 credits
All Certificate in Global Health courses (required core AND electives) must be completed with a grade of C or higher. Students must earn a minimum grade of C in each certificate course and a minimum certificate completion GPA of 2.5. Substitutions for courses must be specifically approved by the Program Director.
