Lecture (2.0)

 Introductory course to familiarize incoming athletic training undergraduate students with the domains of athletic training and the importance of evidence-based practice in sports medicine.

Combined Lecture and Laboratory (3.0)

Course is designed to develop athletic training skills for beginning athletic training students. Course material includes basic knowledge and skills essential for taping, wrapping, padding, and supporting athletic injuries, and also covers aspects of anatomy and functional movement as well as an introduction to therapeutic modalities.

SML 310: Therapeutic Modalities Lab (Summer 2011- Summer 2012; Spring 2015)

Laboratory Section only (1.0)

Course material includes the instruction and demonstration of properly applying various physical agents intended to optimize tissue healing based on the clinician's assessment of the nature of a pathology, the tissues involved, and the stage of healing.

SMD 204: First Aid for Health Professionals (Spring 2010- present)

Lecture and Laboratory Sections (3.0)

• Course material includes the instruction of appropriate first aid and basic life support procedures based on ASHI certification standards and is intended to prepare future health professionals to respond appropriately to medical emergencies that require first aid.

SMD 271: First Aid & Athletic Training (Fall 2009- present)

Combined Lecture and Laboratory (2.0)

• Course material includes the instruction of appropriate first aid and CPR procedures based on ASHI certification standards. Students develop a basic understanding of athletic training and the role of an athletic trainer in the traditional setting, and they learn to describe the causes, signs & symptoms, initial management, and prevention of common athletic injuries.

Lecture (3.0)

• Course coincides with athletic training student clinical experience and includes case study presentations of injuries, illnesses, and/or other conditions.
