Alcoholics Anonymous	<p>AA is a worldwide fellowship of sober alcoholics whose recovery is based on 12 steps. AA's sole purpose is to carry the AA message to the alcoholic who still suffers. American Council on Alcoholism, Inc.	<p>ACA is a not-for-profit, voluntary educational organization founded in 1953 to promote understanding among individuals, professionals and organizations that alcoholism is a treatable illness. ACA recognizes a distinction between responsible drinking and alcohol abuse, and encourages comprehensive college campus alcohol education programs, including employee, student and faculty assistance.</p>
American Council for Drug Education	<p>ACDE is a national, nonprofit organization that offers education about the health hazards associated with the use of drugs. While its efforts encompass the public-at-large, it is mindful of the particularly urgent educational needs of children, adolescents and young adults, co-dependents, co-workers of drug abusers, expectant mothers, disadvantaged minorities and other high-risk groups.</p>
