College Highlights

College of Arts and Sciences:

- The newly renovated Mather Planetarium is used by the Department of Geology & Astronomy and hosts nearly 4,000 visitors per year.
- WCU hosts the largest all-poetry writing conference in the United States.
- The Robert B. Gordon Natural Area is a natural laboratory for environmental studies, in keeping with WCU's commitment to sustainability.

College of Business and Public Affairs:

- The College is AACSB accredited. Only 30% of business programs maintain this status.
- The Social Work program is accredited through the Council on Social Work Education.
- The new CBPA building (to left) is anticipated to open during the 2016-2017 academic year.

College of Education:

- The COE is connected to over 65 school districts in southeastern Pennsylvania to provide students with early teaching experiences.
- The Professional Testing Center on campus offers Pearson PECT tests (including PAPA) and the Praxis.

College of Health Science:

- The CHS partnered with Main Line Health in order to host the first Health Sciences Summer Academy, which educated local middle school students in health sciences academic and career opportunities.
- In 2013, the Campbell Soup Company created a 3-tiered partnership with the CHS—research, student internships and community involvement.

College of Visual and Performing Arts:

- The WCU marching band will appear in the 2015 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade
- The department of Theatre and Dance hosted the Kennedy Center Regional Theatre Festival in 2014 and is hosting the American College Dance Festival in 2015.
- The School of Music assists in hosting the International Trumpet Guild Conference and the regional National Association of Teachers of Singing Conference.

How to Apply:

After applying online at www.wcupa.edu, please submit the following supporting documents to the Office of Admissions.

- An official transcript from all post-secondary institutions attended (military transcripts, as applicable).
- A personal statement.
- An application fee of \$45.00.
- If fewer than 30 earned college credits:
 - An official high school transcript
 - SAT/ACT scores
 - If the applicant has been out of high school for 3 or more years, SAT/ACT scores are not required.

Academic Program Notes:

While a 2.00 cumulative average is required for most academic programs, WCU Admissions prioritizes applications based on the quality of academic credentials. Some of our more competitive programs include:

PLEASE NOTE that Athletic Training, Nursing (BSN), and Physics-Engineering (cooperative program with Pennsylvania State University) are not open to transfer applicants. Students can apply to Pre-Major (Undeclared) if they complete fewer than 45 college credits before transferring.
