Located at 7th and Market streets at the Mellon Independence Center in the heart of Center City, WCU's new downtown location offers flexible, convenient degree options that include graduate and undergraduate programs in Social Work, Criminal Justice, Special Education and Reading, with plans to add additional programs throughout 2014. This site was developed by the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) as the Philadelphia Multi-University Center and will offer an array of education programs from multiple PASSHE universities in one convenient location.

Both the WCU undergraduate Criminal Justice and Social Work programs are designed for students who have completed the majority of their general education credits and are looking to complete their upper division undergraduate social work or criminal justice requirements.

New Facilities

Completed in August 2012, the 72,575 square foot **Student Recreation Center** includes "state of the art" features such as an extensive fitness area on two levels, elevated walking/jogging track, two-court gym, and a three-story climbing wall. The University's commitment to sustainability is highlighted in the Recreation Center's two green roofs, solar panels, a live green wall, and the usage of a number of recycled materials in the interior part of the building. The campus's geothermal system also heats and cools the building.





Opening this fall, the **East Village Apartments** will offer incoming transfer students and returning students the opportunity to live in one of

five new three-story apartment buildings. Each apartment offers a living room, kitchen and two bathrooms and can accommodate four students - each with a private bedroom. What Transfer Students Need to Know

A complete application includes:

- 1. An official transcript from all post-secondary institutions attended.
- 2. A personal statement.
- 3. An application fee of \$45.
- 4. An official high school transcript and SAT/ACT scores if less than 30 credits have been completed. If the applicant has been out of high school for 3 years then they do not have to submit SAT/ACT scores.

An admissions decision will not be made until your application is complete. It is the student's responsibility to have all of the above items forwarded to the Office of Admissions.

WCU operates on a rolling admissions policy. It is recommended that fall semester applicants have all materials submitted early in the proceeding spring semester. Students applying for spring admission are encouraged to have all materials submitted early in the proceeding fall semester. If enrollment limits are met before this time, admissions will be closed.

Certain academic majors have limited enrollment and/or higher admissions standards. Some of these majors include Nursing, Communication Studies, Criminal Justice, Computer Science, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Pre-Med, Pharmaceutical Product Development, Social Work, Education and Business.

Financial Aid

All students and parents are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) before March 1 for priority processing. The Office of Financial Aid will assess the students' eligibility for need-based scholarships; loans; federal, state, and institutional grants. Financial Aid packages will be mailed in early April



Did You Know?


- WCU enrolls the largest number of transfer students in the State System of Higher Education.


