Tenure-Track Position, Department of Physics Condensed Matter/Solid-State Physicist College of Arts and Sciences

Join a vibrant campus community whose excellence is reflected in its diversity and student success. West Chester University is seeking applicants for a Condensed Matter Physicist. This is a tenure-track position starting August, 2012. The position is offered at the Assistant Professor level, but exceptionally well-qualified candidates with significant experience can be considered for the rank of Associate Professor. Actual starting salary is commensurate with experience.

Applicants must possess a Ph. D. in Physics, Engineering or a related discipline at the time of appointment. The successful candidate must be able to teach the full range of undergraduate physics courses and give evidence of a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching. Finalists must successfully complete an on-campus interview that includes a demonstration of effective communication and teaching by presenting a research seminar and/or class lecture. The Department seeks a scientist who will establish and sustain an active research program in an area of condensed matter physics or a closely related discipline such as material science. Persons with research programs that can collaborate with current WCU faculty or near-by faculty and potentially involve undergraduate students will be given preference.
