 Transfer students entering with 40-70 credits need only two S and two W courses; those entering with more than 70 credits need only one S and one W course at the 300/400 level.

XI. FREE ELECTIVES

Take enough free electives to complete <u>120 credits</u>. College preparatory courses (e.g., MATQ20, MATQ30) do NOT count towards graduation. The actual number of free electives required will vary depending upon multiple factors.

<u>Repeat Policy</u>: Please note that WCU allows students a total of 6 maximum repeats for their entire undergraduate career. A course may be repeated a maximum of 2 times only! The most recent grade, regardless of whether it is higher or lower, will be the grade used for the GPA calculation. Courses taken at WCU <u>CANNOT</u> be repeated at an external institution!

Remedial Q courses can be repeated up to three times. Failure to receive the appropriate passing grade will result in dismissal from WCU.

Academic Probation: Students are placed on Academic Probation if their cumulative GPA falls below 2.0. Students will have 1 academic semester to regain good standing and will be required to create an Academic Recovery Plan (ARP) with their advisors.
