What Is APSCUF?

- We are the bargaining agent for the bargaining unit that comprises faculty and coaches at 14 state-owned universities across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- We are your labor union.
- We are a member-driven and -governed association.
- Through collective bargaining, we represent both dues-paying members and non-members, as both are part of the bargaining unit.
- However, members have access to more benefits than non-members.

Some Distinctions Between APSCUF's and Other Faculty Collective Bargaining Agreements

- Bargaining unit includes all faculty, tenured and tenure track and adjuncts.
- Strength in numbers: Statewide membership comprising 14 institutions (many faculty unions bargain for a single college within a university).
- We have conversion language for temporary faculty to tenure track.
- No administrators' discretionary merit pay. (We all know how that works in practice.) Single salary scale with step increases and COLA increases.
- APSCUF salaries increased as scheduled even during an economic downturn (COVID).
- Includes language on hiring, tenure and promotion, and curriculum committee, not solely the "mandatory subjects of bargaining."

What APSCUF Does for You?

- Protects you throughout the five-year tenure process with a transparent, documented evaluation process. No gotchas.
- Tenure and promotion follows the collective bargaining agreement and local “**TeP**” process, see Provost’s website for full documentation of the process.
- Ensures the primacy of the role of faculty in curricular decisions via the curriculum committee (**CAPC**)
- Bargains for excellent healthcare, dental, and vision benefits.
- Provides preferential hiring rights for adjuncts with 60+ credit hours
- And on and on... See your purple CBA book.

When to Get in Touch with APSCUF

- When you have a question about taking leave. This can be complex and the union will make sure your needs get met.
- When you have questions or concerns about an evaluation.
- When you have concerns about your work environment, office conditions, etc.
- When you are the recipient of a complaint.
- When you have a question about the CBA and the meaning of the language.
- We will help you get answers to any question you have.
