WCU total enrollment increased 10% between 2013 and 2018



PASSHE total enrollment decreased 13% during same time period.

WCU increase was 216 students

What is a Graduate Student Assistant (GA) at WCU?

- What can they be used for?
 - Assist with research, project management etc. They are not teaching assistants and can not grade, teach class, etc.
- What is in it for them?
 - Learning experience for them high-impact practice; tuition remission and stipend
- ▶ How do I get one?
 - Deans distribute GAs among departments and should be used for recruitment and retention; can be purchased using other funds (e.g., grant funds)



Impacts on Student Financial Aid

- Student Withdrawing from Class/Semester
 - Impact on financial aid Federal and State
- Change of enrollment status
 - Add/Drop classes full time vs half time
 - Graduation if graduating early or pushing it back a term or two
- Financial Crisis

Students should contact Financial Aid to discuss the impact before withdrawing or changing enrollment status. Also, if you hear of students experiencing financial difficulties please have them contact Financial Aid.

Financial Aid Disbursed 2020-2021 Totals

- Federal Aid
 - Pell Grant: \$17,732,682 (based on EFC)
 - ► SEOG: \$614,671 (WCU has discretion to award)
 - ► Federal Work Study: \$681,758
- Pennsylvania Aid
 - PHEAA Grant: \$9,745,566
- Institutional Aid
 - Merit: \$3,389,106
 - Grant: \$3,000,853

West Chester University in Philadelphia

- ► Located on the concourse level of the Lits Building at 8th & Market
- ► Fall 2013 Enrolled first cohort
 - Increase educational opportunities and access to an affordable education within the Philadelphia region
 - Meeting the need of working adults with a convenient location and flexible offerings
 - ▶ Strengthening strategic partnerships i.e. Community College of Philadelphia

WCU Programs

- ► <u>Graduate:</u> Master of Social Work; Master of Science in Transformative Education; and NEW for Fall 2021, the Master of Public Administration
- <u>Undergraduate (Degree-completion):</u> Bachelor of Social Work; Bachelor of Science in Management; RN-BSN (Online)



Facilities and Services

- ▶ 26,000 sq ft of Academic and Administrative space
 - ▶ 15 Classrooms -two that are setup for full videoconferencing
 - Conference room
 - > 20+ Offices for faculty and staff
 - ▶ Student Lounge with computers, vending machine, water, and microwave for students to eat/study/collaborate
 - Gender neutral bathroom
 - ► Lactation room model space for main campus design
- Services for Student Success
 - Student Success Center tutoring, library resources, resume writing
 - Counselor on-site two days per week for students
 - ▶ Student Service Concierge to assist students and connect with main campus
 - Open Computer lab and loaner laptops
 - Student Engagement committee comprised of faculty, staff, and students



WCU @ Delaware County Community College (DCCC)

- On-site at the DCCC Marple Township campus
- Strategic partnership with our top feeder community college
 - Increase access to an affordable education
 - Meeting the need of working adults with a convenient location, flexible offerings, and ample parking
 - ▶ DCCC has provided classroom and office space for WCU
- WCU Programs
 - <u>Undergraduate:</u> Bachelor of Science in Management; Online Concurrent RN-BSN (students enrolled in ASN/BSN)
 - Exploring other degree completion programs
 - ▶ Fall 2018 was the first cohort of students
