APSCUF represents all faculty, classroom and non-classroom, both tenured and tenure track, as well as adjuncts. The collective bargaining agreement between APSCUF and the State System of Higher Education and the local agreements that govern tenure and promotion assure one of the most fair and transparent evaluation processes at any University. Also bargained for you by your union are regular wage increases, healthcare, dental, and vision benefits, and many other fringe benefits. | <p style="text-align: center;">Athletic Advisory Board</p> | <p>The Athletics Advisory Board serves as a review and advisory body to the President of West Chester University. The Board will work closely with the Vice President for Student Affairs and the Director of Athletics assisting with the development of University's Athletics Program. It is made up of 7 faculty members, 6 administrators and three students. Each college or schools has one representative on the board who can serve as a "go to" person with questions about athletics and/or student-athletes.</p> <p>The Board is chaired by the NCAA mandated Faculty Athletics Representative (FAR), Dr. Craig Stevens who is also the chair of the Department of Kinesiology. The FAR's responsibilities include overseeing the well-being of student-athletes and acting as a liaison between academics and athletics. | <p>Committee for Advising Excellence</p> | <p>The Advising Task Force was established in the Fall of 2014 by the Provost to implement the recommendations of the WCU strategic plan. The group comprises members from across the university: faculty representatives from all Colleges; Deans; students; representatives of university offices such as the Registrar and Career Center. It is involved in projects such as advising training, administering advising awards, development and maintenance of the university advising website, and increasing visibility of advising on campus, by attending New Faculty Orientation and other events.</p> |

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| Committee for Excellence and Learning in Teaching (CELT) | <p>The mission of the Committee for Excellence in Learning and Teaching (CELT) includes fostering collaborations among faculty and with students to build a scholarly community around issues of teaching and learning. With members from all areas of faculty and administration, CELT's goals are to enhance curricula and instructional modes to actively engage learners in connecting theoretical and applied knowledge and improve the quality of their learning. Programs sponsored by CELT include Book Discussion Groups, an annual early-summer Workshop on pedagogical topics, and CELT Professional Development Funds for teaching projects (funding up to \$2000.)</p> |
| Faculty Mentoring Committee (FMC) | <p>Building and sustaining a mentoring culture on a higher education campus has been shown to play a critical role in faculty retention and success. The Faculty Mentoring Program (FMP), established in 2008, is open to all part-time and full-time academic and administrative faculty, as defined by the most recent CBA. The FMP offers three targeted programs to support faculty at every career stage: new full-time tenure-track faculty, faculty desiring to seek promotion, and adjunct faculty. The mission of the program is to foster mentoring partnerships among faculty to enhance lifelong professional learning in teaching, scholarship, and service.</p> |
| Faculty Senate | <p>The mission of West Chester University's Faculty Senate is to ensure faculty involvement in the shared governance of the institution. A forum for sharing, evaluating, and shaping institutional policies and other matters that affect the welfare of the University, the Faculty Senate is committed to fostering a climate that promotes the growth and development of faculty and students. Elected senators serve three-year terms and include representatives from each college/school, non-classroom faculty, and temporary/adjunct faculty, as well as at-large seats. Elections are held each spring, and many new senators first serve as a designated Senate proxy. All faculty members are welcome to attend Senate meetings, which are held three times per semester (typically on Friday afternoons). 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| Global Engagement Office | <p>The Global Engagement Office (GEO) was established in 1973. Formally called the Center for International Programs, the GEO provides essential support services for international students, visiting scholars, education abroad, and the National Student Exchange. Students are encouraged to participate in semester or year-long study abroad programs as well as spring break and summer faculty-led programs. The GEO hosts a Study Abroad Fair each fall in Sykes Student Union where students have the opportunity to meet with WCU faculty and study abroad representatives to learn about programs all over the world. In addition, study abroad representatives visit campus during the spring semester. The schedule for these visits is available in the office at the beginning of each spring semester. The GEO assists international students to gain entry to WCU, to serve these students once enrolled and to educate U.S. students globally by fostering opportunities for education abroad and exchange programs. All West Chester University immigration services are provided through the GEO. A variety of services such as immigration advising, programming and orientation are provided for scholars and students from WCU and more than 40 countries.</p> |
| Honors College | <p>Modeling a commitment to liberal arts and cross-disciplinary education, the Honors College (HC) celebrates outstanding students and encourages them to strive for a high level of academic excellence. 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| Information Services & Technology, EdTech & User Services | <p>The West Chester University Information Services and Technology Division (IS&T) is dedicated to serving the University mission in all its elements through the strategic application of information technology. IS&T delivers and supports a variety of systems to the University community regardless of their location or device including communications networks, collaboration tools, software applications, and OneDrive cloud storage. EdTech & User Services consists of the IT Help Desk for staff and faculty, D2L (the learning management system) used by WCU to support online education for faculty and students, Tech Fee which acquires, installs, and maintains technologies, and Multimedia Services (Presentation systems and Video Conferencing rooms).</p> |
| Office of Digital Learning and Innovation (ODLI) | <p>Office of Digital Learning and Innovation is a centralized office that supports the development, promotion, implementation, and assessment of distance education programs and courses, as well as digital learning at West Chester University. The office aims to enhance teaching and learning experiences by providing innovative pedagogical and digital strategies to WCU faculty, students, and administrators.</p> |

| <p>WCU Library</p> | <p>West Chester University Libraries is comprised of the Francis Harvey Green Library (FHG Library) and the Presser Music Library. Both libraries offer excellent environments for study and research to serve the university's approximately 15,000 FTE students.</p> <p>The FHG Library consists of six floors and offers a range of seating and meeting spaces for students. Three floors are designated as quiet study space. The floors designated for collaborative work have a variety of seating arrangements – tables with power outlets, booths, informal seating (bean bag chairs/hammocks), workstations designed for group computer use, and 8 group study rooms.
