3 Year Overview

Goal 1: Academic Excellence:



Improve quality through innovative programming

Actions:

1. Revise and update the summer program.
2. Increase interdisciplinary collaboration.
3. Foster faculty and staff development through training and mentoring.
4. Enhance student engagement through programming.
5. Expand support services for upper-level ASP students

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs):

- Improved academic performance for all ASP students.
- Increased engagement with academic departments across campus.
- Increased eligibility for Chi Alpha Epsilon National Honor Society.
- Improved student feedback mechanisms.
- Updates to ASP course offerings across all semesters (ex. Study Abroad and/or other experiential learning tied to credit).
- Positive faculty and staff satisfaction and professional growth metrics.

Goal 2: Student Success & Engagement:



Enhance student learning experiences and outcomes

Actions:

1. Strengthen advising and mentoring systems.
2. Expand opportunities for internships, research, and experiential learning.
3. Develop new academic and co-curricular support services.
4. Strengthen community across cohorts and among ASP alumni
5. Increase ACT 101 student enrollment to 300 by 2028.

Key Performance Indicators:

- Increased retention and graduation rates among ACT/Non-ACT 101 students.
- Higher student satisfaction survey scores (summer, fall, spring of Year 1 and beyond).
- Employment and graduate school placement rates post-graduation.
- Increased participation in new academic and co-curricular support services and in experiential learning opportunities.

Goal 3: Research & Development



Increase research productivity and funding

Actions:

1. Align research priorities with departmental needs and strengths.
2. Foster interdisciplinary and external partnerships.
3. Pursue internal and external grants and funding opportunities.
4. Encourage staff and faculty to pursue professional development opportunities.

Key Performance Indicators:

- Increased number of research grant applications and awards.
- Increased scholarly activity (ex. conference presentation)
- Published works and citation counts.
- Growth in interdisciplinary research projects.

Goal 4: Community Engagement & Outreach



Strengthen partnerships with stakeholders

Actions:

1. Develop partnerships with local businesses, nonprofits, and government organizations.
2. Strengthen existing relationships with non-academic departments on campus.
3. Offer information sessions about ASP for the community
4. Encourage faculty and student participation in service projects.

Key Performance Indicators:

- Increase in community partnerships.
- Attendance and feedback from public events.
- Participation rates in outreach initiatives.
