## Academic Success Program (ASP) Summer Session, 2022

# When: Tuesday, July 5, 2022 to Friday, August 5, 2022

In addition to classes, workshops, tutoring, and other events are required during the week; therefore, students who are employed may only work during the weekends.

#### Where: On Campus!

Classes, workshops, tutoring, and other events will be in-person, on campus.

**Requirements:** Participation in on-campus Placement Assessments: Saturday, May 21, 2022. Active participation in the Summer Session and academic success.

Students must complete the in-person assessments for appropriate course placement for the Summer Session and beyond. Students must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 during the Summer Session to move onto the Fall 2022 semester.

#### Coursework: Students take two courses for a total of six credits.\*

Classes are scheduled from 8:30 a.m. to 11:45 a.m., Monday through Friday. Tutoring, advising, workshops, and other events take place in the afternoon and evenings, Monday through Thursday.

- All students will be enrolled in EDR 120, College Reading & Study Skills
- Students will be enrolled in one of the following s their second course:
  - o WRT 120, Effective Writing I

OR

MAT Q20\*\* (Fundamental Skills in Arithmetic), MAT Q30\*\* (Fundamental Skills in Algebra) or MAT 121 (Introduction to Statistics)

### The Benefits of the Summer Session

ASP students come into the fall semester ahead of other first-year students!

- 1. Students complete the Summer Session with
  - ✓ 6 credits toward their WCU GPA;
  - ✓ 3-6 credits that count toward graduation; and
  - ✓ a jump-start on math requirements, if needed.
- 2. Students become familiar with the campus!
  - ✓ They get to know faculty and staff;
  - ✓ They are familiar with tutoring, advising, and other resources on campus;
  - ✓ They acclimate to on-campus living and the nuances of navigating campus life.
